1. Introduction

- 1.1. These Competition Rules apply to all BSSA events (League Galas and the National Championships). The official competition calendar for the 2025–2026 season is attached as Addendum A.
- 1.2. Summary of Dates of BSSA Competitions:

2. General Rules

- 2.1. All competitions will be held under the prevailing Technical Rules and Regulations of World Aquatics, and any BSSA rules and regulations issued specifically for each competition.
- 2.2. The BSSA will appoint a Meet Director for each competition. Anything not covered by these rules will be decided by the Meet Director in conjunction with the BSSA.
- 2.3. Entries may be restricted and/or deleted at the discretion of the organizing committee.
- 2.4. The meet organizers reserve the right to change the order of events or merge events within a session should this be necessary.
- 2.5. The start time of the later sessions on each day is subject to change (earlier or later) if necessary.
- 2.6. Right of admission always reserved.
- 2.7. Consumption of alcohol and/or any intoxicating beverages is strictly prohibited in the pool area.
- 2.8. All galas will be club based.
- 2.9. Age is at the first day of the competition.

2.10. Age groups for all competitions:

- 2.10.1. Minimum competition age is 7 years.
- 2.10.2. Age groups are: 8/Under; 9 10; 11 12; 13 14; 15 16; and 17/Over for both men and women.



- 2.10.3. Masters age groups are: 25 34 and 35/Over.
- 2.10.4. Relay age groups are: 10/Under (except for 4 X 100m Medley Relays); 11 14; and 15/Over.

2.11. Events Minimum Age for all competitions:

- 2.11.1. Minimum age for 100m Butterfly is 11 years.
- 2.11.2. Minimum age for 200m Freestyle, 200m Back, 200m Breast, and 200m IM is 9 years.
- 2.11.3. Minimum age for 400m Free is 10 years.
- 2.11.4. Minimum age for all other events of length 200m and above is 11 years.
- 2.11.5. Swimmers 8 years and under may only swim 50m events and 100m Freestyle.

2.12. Eligibility:

- 2.12.1. All athletes wishing to compete must be members in good standing of any of the BSSA affiliates and have paid their annual BSSA registration fees.
- 2.12.2. Athletes who are not members of any BSSA affiliate may participate provided an explicit permission from BSSA is first obtained in writing and any fees due paid in advance. For competitions with qualifying times, the athlete's entry times must be ratified by their National Federation.
- 2.13. When entry times are required, only times acquired 1 year prior to the first day of competition will be allowed.
- 2.14. If any part of the competition program cannot be completed due to adverse weather conditions, the Referee and Meet Director may:
 - 2.14.1. Choose to award medals/ribons based on results of the heats if Finals cannot be swum on the final day of the competition.
 - 2.14.2. On any other competition day if/when Finals cannot be swum, choose to reschedule the Finals, or award medals based on results of the heats.
 - 2.14.3. If event heats cannot be completed, choose to cancel the event, or reschedule the heats. If the event is Heats/Finals or Heats/Semi Finals/Finals, the event may be converted to a Timed Final event.
- 2.15. Where time is a major constraint, choose to cancel or convert any part of the program to be swum as Timed Finals.
 - 2.15.1. Change the start time of any session.
 - 2.15.2. Change the order of events.

3. Entries Administration

- 3.1. Fully completed Hytek Team Manager zip file must be received by the closing date of each competition. Entries must be emailed to botswanaswimming@gmail.com
- 3.2. Entry fees are non-refundable, and are due with entries. Any entries without proof of payment of entry fees will not be processed.



- 3.3. Fees are to be paid into the following account: Botswana Swimming Sports Association | First National Bank | Acc No. 62086093574 | Branch: First Place | Code: 281467 | Proof of payment to botswanaswimming@gmail.com
- 3.4. Only designated team managers may: Add or withdraw competitors; Submit or correct entries; Lodge complaints; and/or Lodge appeals.
- 3.5. Team Leaders must check spelling of their athletes' names, date of birth, and entries for correctness.
- 3.6. In the case of a dispute, the referee's decision is final.
- 3.7. Each club shall send a team manager to attend the Team Managers' Meeting, which shall, unless otherwise communicated prior to the event, be held the day before the event. Missing a Team Managers meeting will attract a fine of P500. Teams travelling from outside the town hosting the event shall be allowed to send a proxy to the Team Manager's meeting.
- 3.8. After the closing date for entries, late or additional entries may only be made at the Team Managers' Meeting. There will be no late entries accepted after the Team Managers' Meeting.
- 3.9. Late entries fees will be applicable as follows.
 - 3.9.1. From Closing Date of Entries but before Closing Date of Corrections: two times (X2) the original entry fee.
 - 3.9.2. At the Team Managers' Meeting: five times (X5) the original entry fee.
 - 3.9.3. There will be no processing of late entries and withdrawals after the closing date of corrections. All those shall be dealt with at the Team Managers' Meeting.
 - 3.9.4. The Team Managers Meeting is the last opportunity for late/additional entries thereafter no late entries will be accepted.

4. Relavs

- 4.1. Relays must be submitted at the same time as individual event entries to indicate participation in a relay event.
- 4.2. Relay names must be received in the correct following, on the prescribed forms, and must be submitted before the end of the preceding the session in which the relay will be swum, this will be confirmation of the relay entry. Relay changes after this time will be subject to a medical certificate.
- 4.3. If the relay form is not submitted, the team will be withdrawn from the event.
- 4.4. The names of the relay swimmers may be changed up to one hour before the start of the session.
- 4.5. Only swimmers entered into the competition may swim in relays.
- 4.6. A mixed relay team consists of two men and two women.
- 4.7. Teams may enter as many relay teams as they possible can, but only one relay team will earn points. Event specific rules may impose a limit on the number of relay teams.
- 4.8. A swimmer may swim up in relays but only be entered in one age-group relay per event.
- 4.9. Unattached swimmers may not swim relay events.



5. Withdrawals

- 5.1. Withdrawals at Team Managers' Meeting incur no penalty.
- 5.2. After the Team Managers Meeting, Withdrawals will incur a fine of P200 per event unless it's for certified medical reasons. The medical certificate shall be submitted at the time of withdrawal or as requested by the Meet Director.
- 5.3. No Shows, whether in the heats or finals, will incur a fine P200 per event and the swimmer may not compete in any other event until this fine has been paid.
- 5.4. Withdrawals from Finals must be done before the end of the session the heats were swum or as notified by the referee. It would be really helpful if these withdrawals are done as soon as possible after the results are published, as this would be useful for notifying the alternates for the particular event. Alternates must report for the finals in case they are needed, otherwise the No Show fine of P200 will apply.
- 5.5. If the referee deems a swimmer to have deliberately false started or not performed to the swimmers capabilities, the swimmer will be fined P500 and will be withdrawn from all their events, including relays for that session.
- 5.6. Clubs are responsible for the collection and payment of fines accrued by their swimmers.

6. Disqualification and Protests

- 6.1. When a competitor who competed in a final is disqualified for any reason, including medical control, the position he/she would have held shall be awarded to the competitor who finished next and all the lower placing competitors in the final shall be advanced one place. If the disqualification occurs after the presentation of awards, the awards shall be returned and given to the appropriate competitors applying the foregoing provisions.
- 6.2. A Team Manager of a competitor who is disqualified may, for the purpose of clarification only, consult with the Admin Referee to ascertain the details (Event, heat, and lane numbers; reason) of the disqualification. Any follow-up to the disqualification shall be in the form of a protest.
- 6.3. A written protest may be lodged with the Admin Referee within 30 minutes of the publication of results or announcement of the disqualification. The protest must be accompanied by a payment of P500.
- 6.4. The BSSA will appoint and announce the members of the Jury of Appeal at the beginning of the competition.
- 6.5. In the case of a dispute, the Jury of Appeal's decision is final and binding.

7. Awards

7.1. Standard points for all competitions will be allocated for places 1 – 8 as follows:

7.1.1. Individual Events:

1 st place	10 points
2 nd place	8 points
3 rd place	6 points
4 th place	5 points

5 th place	4 points
6 th place	3 points
7 th place	2 points
8 th place	1 point



7.1.2. Relays:

1 St place	20 points

7.2. League Galas:

7.2.1. Ribbons will be awarded to the top three places in each event: Gold for first place, Silver for second place, and Bronze for third place.

7.3. Nationals:

- 7.3.1. Medals and medal points will be awarded as follows:
 - 7.3.1.1. Gold Medal 6 points
 - 7.3.1.2. Silver Medal 3 points
 - 7.3.1.3. Bronze Medal 1 point
- 7.3.2. Top 3 finishers per finals event per age group will receive a gold, silver, or bronze medal, respectively.
- 7.3.3. Top 8 finishers per finals event per age group will be awarded points as per Rule 7.1
- 7.3.4. Top Overall Points (Male / Female) This will be calculated based on the number of medal points awarded for position Gold, Silver, Bronze as per Rule 7.3.1
- 7.3.5. Victor / Victrix Ludorum Awards will be awarded to swimmers per age group who have the most medal points (as per Rule 7.3.1) for individual events.
- 7.3.6. Foreign swimmers who finish in the top three positions (medal position) will receive an appropriate visitor's medal.
- 7.3.7. Foreign swimmers are not eligible for Victor / Victrix Ludorum Awards and overall top female/male awards.
- 7.3.8. Clubs will be ranked according to the number of standard points earned as per rule 7.1
 - 7.3.8.1. Top 3 clubs will receive trophies.
 - 7.3.8.2. Foreign clubs are not eligible for club awards.
 - 7.3.8.3. TEAM SPIRIT CUP, which is a Floating Trophy will be decided by the BSSA for the team that displays the most spirit (War cries, cheering etc.), as well as best SPORTSMANSHIP. Foreign clubs are not eligible for the Spirit Cup.

8. Medical and Doping Testing

8.1. A medical officer who shall be present throughout the competition, shall be provided by the Organizing Committee.



- 8.2. Facilities for doping control shall be provided, in accordance with World Aquatics Rules.
- 8.3. The doping control shall also be carried out according to World Aquatics Rules and the tests shall be made at laboratories appearing in the International Olympic Committee approved list.
- 8.4. The banned substances and practices are those contained in the WA list.
- 8.5. Botswana Swimming, in recognition that the use of substances or practices which artificially enhance a swimmer's performance is illegal, and in recognition that there is a necessity to fight this malpractice, shall implement random testing during training and at any time in and out of competition according to the decision of the Africa Aquatics Bureau.

9. Technical Officials

- 9.1. Each team must submit the names of BSSA-registered and available technical officials with their entries. Failure to do so will result in a P500 fine per official. An additional P500 fine will apply for any official absent at the start of a session, and swimmers from the team may be excluded. Entries will not be processed without this submission.
- 9.2. An Accredited BSSA Officials list will be made available to all clubs before Nationals. This list will be used through-out all sessions. the However it is the clubs responsibility to ensure Officials that are announced that are in their club are present and active during sessions.
- 9.3. Only competition-accredited coaches and team managers are allowed on deck during warmup sessions.
- 9.4. The number of technical officials will be based roughly on the number of swimmers as follows.
 - 9.4.1.1 4 swimmers, one judge per heat per session.
 - 9.4.2.5 10 swimmers, one judge and one timekeeper for every session.
 - 9.4.3. 11 and over swimmers, a minimum of three officials, two judges and one timekeeper for every session.
- 9.5. All technical officials must be correctly attired with white shirts and navy-blue/black trousers or skirts are required.

10. Marshalling

- 10.1.Swimmers who do not report to marshalling on time or are No Shows will be fined P200 per event, and will not be permitted to compete further until the fine is paid. Teams are responsible for collection and payment of fines.
- 10.2. The marshalling area is strictly reserved for swimmers swimming in the upcoming heats/events and the nominated marshals. Coaches may go into the marshalling area if requested.
- 10.3. Swimmers arriving late to the marshalling area may be reported to the referee who may disqualify the swimmer from event. The marshals, in conjunction with the referee shall determine whether a swimmer is late or not.
- 10.4.Once marshalled and seated, swimmers may not leave their seat unless called for their race or instructed by marshals.
- 10.5. Swimmers may bring personal electronics (e.g. iPods) into the marshalling area, provided: (a) they remain responsible for their belongings, (b) the volume does not disturb others, and (c) they are still



- able to hear and follow marshal instructions. Marshals and other persons are not responsible for any electronics.
- 10.6. Marshals will manage flow to the start area to maintain order and prevent confusion between heats; however, it remains the swimmer's responsibility to ensure timely arrival and correct participation in their designated heat.
- 10.7. While waiting at the start area, swimmers must: (a) remain quiet, (b) stay dressed if conditions require, (c) be ready with cap/goggles before walking to the blocks, and (d) only undress once called to the blocks and the referee gives the short whistles.
- 10.8. For finals of events with heats, semifinals, or finals, alternates must report to the marshalling area together with the finalists and are expected to comply with all marshalling rules outlined in this section.

11. Ceremonies

- 11.1.Team Managers should ensure appropriate behavior of their teams during the performing of the National Anthem and Opening Speeches.
- 11.2. Swimmers must present themselves in good time to the marshalling area and in correct attire for a medal/ribbon ceremony. The correct attire is closed shoes, long pants or club top or a full tracksuit.
- 11.3. Only medal/ribbon winners are allowed on the podium during medal/ribbon presentations.

12. Time Trials

- 12.1. Time trial may be applied for in any competition.
- 12.2.A written application providing reasons for a time trial must be received at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time trial.
- 12.3. The fee for a time trial will be P800 and should be submitted with the written application.
- 12.4. If granted, a time trial will be held at the end of the first session of the day.

13. Advertising and Branding

- 13.1. Swim caps and racing swimsuits must comply with any BSSA and World Aquatics Branding and Advertising rules.
- 13.2. Only official team caps may be worn while competing.

14. Facility Etiquette

14.1. There will be a specific seating arrangement for Athletes, Officials and Spectators for all galas for the respective venues. This arrangement must be adhered to without fail. No spectators are allowed on the pool deck. No alcohol shall be allowed on the premises of the venue. Clubs shall ensure that there is order and proper conduct of their swimmers and parents at all events.



15. League Gala Events 2025 - 2026

15.1. Entry fees for League Galas shall be: P50/Swimmer, P30/Event, and P120/Relay (shared equally amongst team relay members). Session programs will cost P10/session.

16.4. Nationals Specific Eligibility Rules

- 16.4.1. In addition to the general rules outlined in this document, the following apply specifically to the Botswana National Championships:
- 16.4.2. All entries must include a valid entry time for each event, achieved within the past 12 months prior to the first day of the competition. *No Time (NT)* entries will not be accepted.
- 16.4.3. Only Long Course (LC) times or converted Short Course (SC) times achieved within the past 12 months will be accepted.
- 16.4.4. Foreign Athletes who are not BSSA members must submit clearance from their National Federation by the entry deadline, and all submitted times must be verified by their Federation.
- 16.4.5. If a swimmer has no official time for an event, the club may request a written concession from the Meet Director or Organizing Committee, citing compelling reasons. Approval is at the discretion of the organizers.
- 16.4.6. Each club may designate up to TWO accredited Team Managers and up to FIVE accredited Coaches per day to oversee competition administration and access restricted areas.
